



PHYSICAL THERAPY

Physical therapists help children develop gross motor skills such as:

- Sitting
- Standing
- Walking

Physical therapists evaluate for bracing and DME such as walkers and wheelchairs.






OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

Occupational therapists work to help children improve skills such as:

- Functional fine motor skills
- Feeding/eating
- Dressing
- Self-care
- Play skills
- Improving independence at home and in the community.
- Communication (e.g. use of computer or communication device).










MEDICAL THERAPY CONFERENCE

Pediatric subspecialty physicians provide medical direction for MTU services and help with plans of care.

Services based on an individual's medical needs, not formularies.








PARENT INVOLVEMENT
